



Separation of Church and State?



ALWAYS REMEMBER WHEN WE PREACH ON THE SIDEWALK, WE ARE NOT ONLY APPLYING OUR FREEDOM OF SPEECH OUT THERE IN THE FIELD BUT MORE SIGNIFICANT IS THAT WE ARE EXERCISING OUR FREEDOM OF RELIGION.
